

first homosexual rights groups formed, the Scientific-Humanitarian Committee and the Order of Chaeronea




word "faggot" first used in print to reference gays

"All the fagots [sic] (sissies) will be dressed in drag tonight"


first known British trans woman, Roberta Cowell, underwent reassignment surgery & changed her birth certificate



Homosexual Law Reform Society founded and campaigned for the legalization of same-sex relationships in the UK



Minorities Research Group became the UK's first lesbian social and political organisation; eventually published a monthly journal, Arena Three



The Beaumont Society, a trans support group, founded to promote information, education, and research



The Sexual Offences Act decriminalized homosexuality in England, though it remained illegal in the Merchant Navy, Armed Forces, Scotland, Northern Ireland, Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man



LGBT community members responded to a police raid on the Stonewall Inn with a series of spontaneous acts of violence known as the "Stonewall Riots"



first Pride held in London with approximately 2,000 participants



London Lesbian and Gay Switchboard, an information and support helpline, established



Maureen Colquhoun becomes the UK's first openly lesbian Member of Parliament



creation of the rainbow flag as a symbol of gay and lesbian pride




the UK's first
Black Gay

Group formed



first UK AIDs charity, the Terry Higgins Trust, is established after the death of Terry Higgins from AIDs



Chris Smith becomes the UK's first openly gay MP

Section 28 of the Local Government Act 1988 introduced restricting LGBT+ education; abolished in 2000 in Scotland and repealed in 2003 in England, Wales, and Northern Ireland

#### stated that a local authority,

"shall not intentionally promote homosexuality or publish material with the intention of promoting homosexuality,"

#### or

"promote the teaching in any maintained school of the acceptability of homosexuality as a pretended family relationship"

OutRage is formed in response to the murders of five gay men; called for police to begin protection of gay and bi men, rather than arresting them


#### Demand The Tories Repeal Section 28

Section 28 has been used by local authorities more than 35 times to deny lesbian and gay applications for grants and facilities. Many teachers are now afraid to give factual information about homosexuality in class.

First professional footballer came out as gay, Justin Fashanu; later committed suicide



the first formal meeting between the **UK Prime Minister** (John Major) and **LGBT** activists



murder of Marsha P. Johnson, an African American transgender woman who was also an LGBTQ activist and advocate for trans people of colour



UK charity, Mermaids, founded to offer resources to young people, their families an carers, and professional. working with gender variant young people



**UK Government** recognized same-sex partners for immigration purposes



Waheed Alli became the first openly gay member of the House of Lords and one of a few openly gay Muslims



the Admiral Duncan, a gay pub in Soho, is bombed, with 3 people killed and at least 70 wounded



equal rights granted to same-sex couples applying for adoption



**Employment Equality** (Sexual Orientation) Regulations become UK law, illegalising discrimination against lesbians, gay and bi people in the workplace



Civil Partnership
Act 2004 passed,
granting same-sex
unions certain
rights in the UK



2005, Christopher Cramp and Matthew Roche, the first couple to complete a Civil Partnership in the UK. Mr. Roche died from cancer the next day.

the Gender Recognition Act 2004 gave trans\* persons legal recognition of their gender, with rights to a new birth certification, but listed options remain limited to a binary "male" or "female"



Education for All campaign launched to address homophobic bullying in schools

UK Courts rule in favour of a gay couple refused a double room by a bed and breakfast in 2008





Marriage (Same-Sex Couples) Act passed in England and Wales

First Trans Pride event took place in Brighton



US legalised same-sex marriage



49 are dead and 53 injured in a shooting at Pulse, a gay nightclub in the US



Prince William appears on the cover of gay magazine
Attitude stating that "no one should be bullied because of their sexuality"



Scotland embedded LGBTI teaching throughout national curriculum



Same-sex marriage became legal in Northern Ireland, the last country in the British Isles to grant marriage equality
