'Diplomacy' refers to the management of foreign affairs. Formal diplomats are officially named by governments: they're people like ambassadors, and are the traditional focus of international political scholars. But more recently, theorists have begun thinking about the *informal* ways that everyday people interact...and how those more local interactions help to shape international relations. 'Tracks' of diplomacy refer to different levels and sectors through which global issues are impacted. Whatever sector you're interested in, that field has an effect on international relations — and so do gender issues within it. Choose your track to explore more.

Track Pass: **JOURNALISM**

Journalism and Media Diplomacy

Journalism has a major impact on foreign affairs. By shaping public opinion, the media can influence international relations and policy. For example:

- the US communicated with the terrorists behind the 1979-1981 Iran hostage crisis almost exclusively through the press;
- media coverage can anger or calm the public in times of war, stress, and conflict;
- groups like WikiLeaks can undermine (or support) national and human security.

Journalists often receive access to spaces where formal diplomacy happens, and thus have a special responsibility and power in diplomacy.
